THE STRAIT GATE AND NARROW WAY

In Matthew 7:13-14, Christ said, “Enter ye in at the strait gate: for wide is the gate, and broad is the way, that leadeth to destruction, and many there be which go in thereat: because strait is the gate, and narrow is the way, which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it.”

Have you ever been driving down the road to get to a destination only to become lost? What is the first thing you reach for? The road map, of course. You seek the directions to find the way to reach your original destination.

Friend, there are two places that the human race is ever rushing toward. Those places are Heaven and Hell, and according to Matthew 7:13-14, a great many are headed toward the latter. But thanks be to God, who gave us the spiritual “road map” to guide us toward Heaven!

THE TWO ROADS EXAMINED

Christ told us about the two roads. One leads to life while the other leads to destruction. While it is a command to choose the path that leads to life, notice that the command is also a choice. Christ left the choice of which path to choose up to us.

The first path is described as being wide and broad. The term, “wide” means flat and the second term, “broad” means spacious. Think of this road like a four-lane highway, laid out flat; or a four-lane express-way. Most people like to take these roads because they, while crowded, are roomy and allow people to go with the flow.

The second path is described as being strait and narrow. The word, “strait” means difficult. The second term, “narrow” means crowded. This is like traveling uphill, on a narrow road that is full of fallen branches and pot-holes. People do not like these types of roads because they are hard to travel.

While the first road described sounds like the one that is easy to travel, Christ tells us that the destination is destruction. The path that we would not want to travel is the one that leads to the destination that we want, life. Let us apply this first century lesson to our modern times.

There are thousands of denominations with billions of members. Most denominations say that we are all going to heaven, yet we are just taking different roads. Friend, that flies in the face of what Jesus said in John 14:6, “Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me.” Also, in Matthew 7:13-14, Christ gives only one road that leads to life.

The denominational world tries several doctrines that try to deny what is told in the Bible concerning salvation. Some say that you can believe what you want. Christ said, “I said therefore unto you, that ye shall die in your sins: for if ye believe not that I am He, ye shall die in your sins.” (John 8:24)
